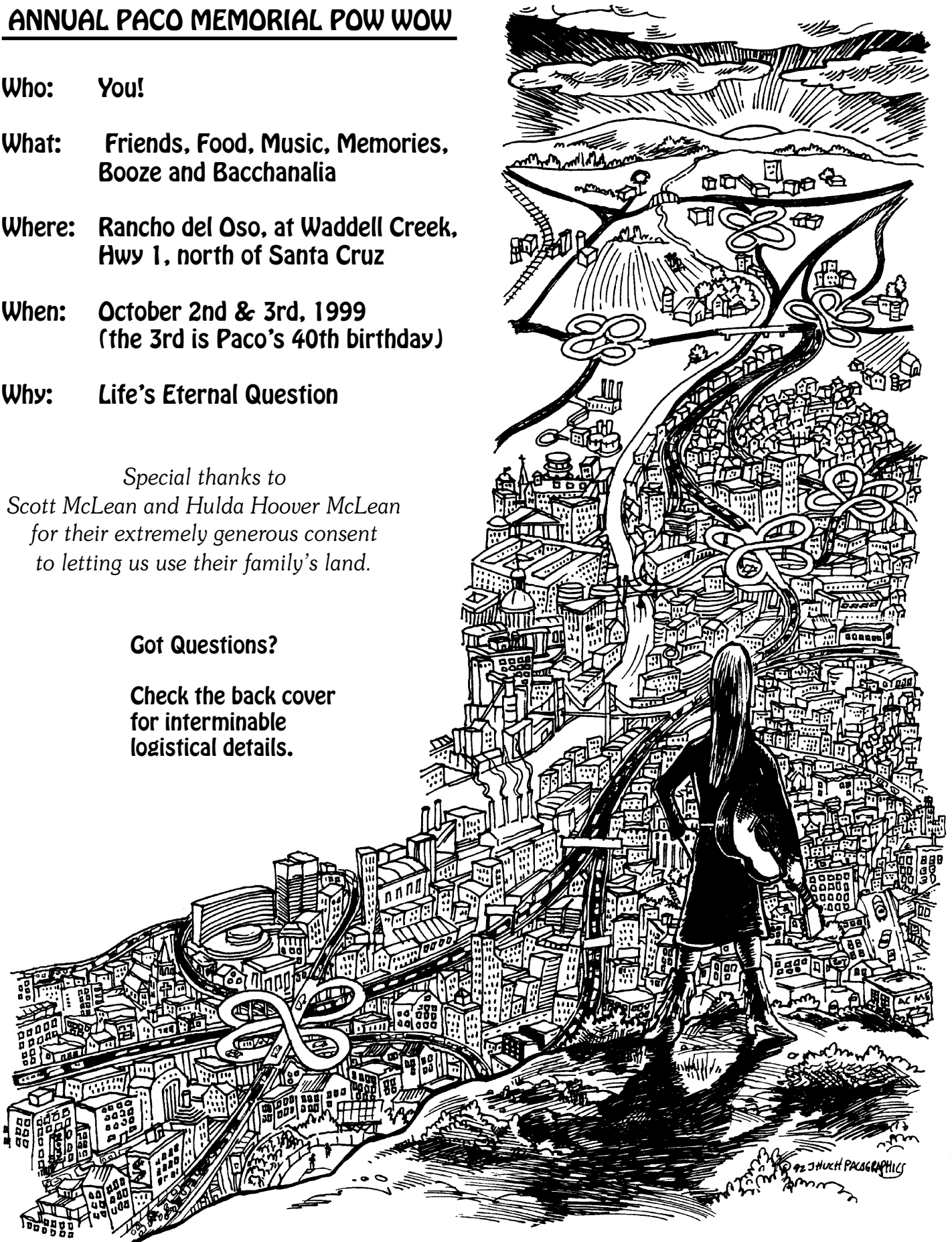

Interminable Logistics

As Stan said in one of his emails, a lot of the organizational stuff seems to happen quite magically . Nevertheless, there are some things that could be improved upon over last year's gathering.

KEEP IT LOW-KEY
